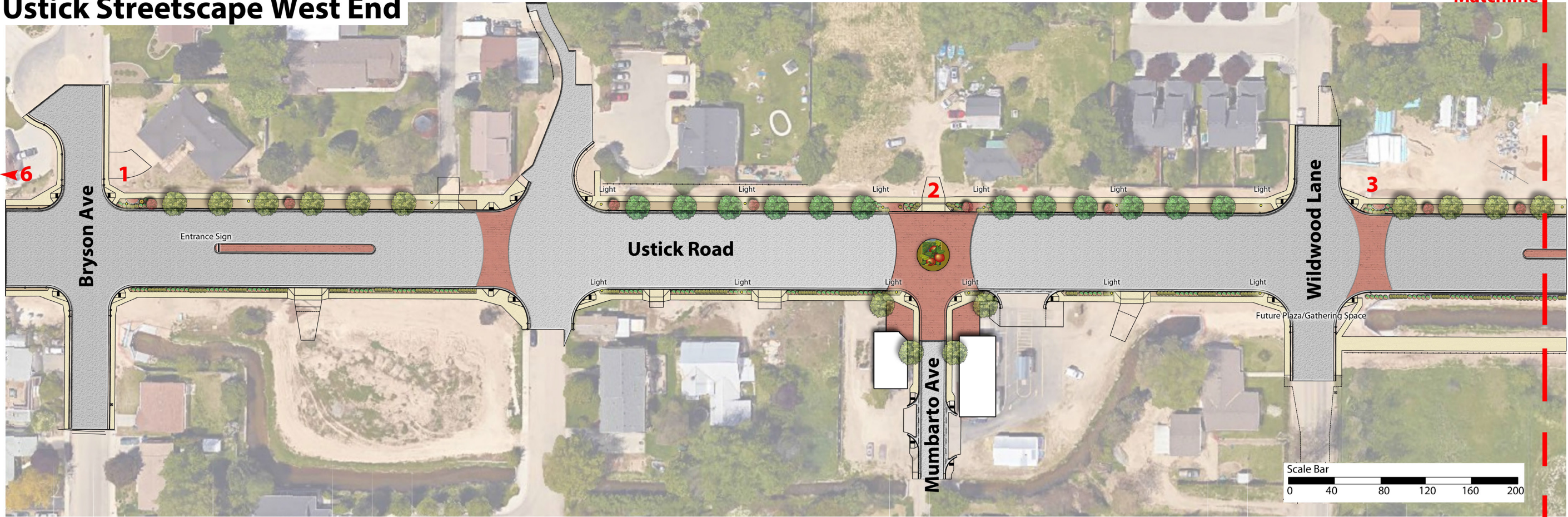


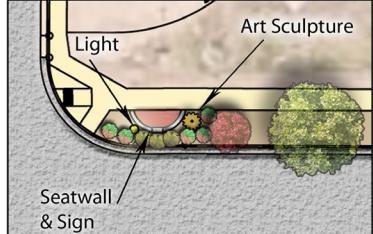

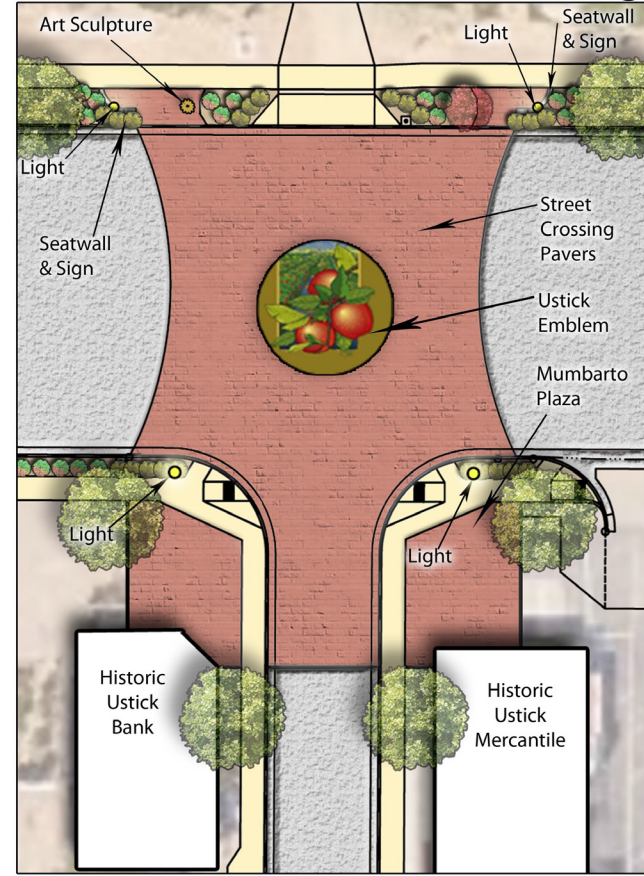
Ustick Streetscape West End



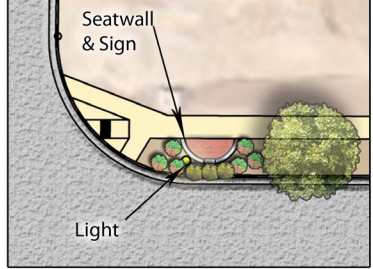
1 North Corner Bryson & Ustick



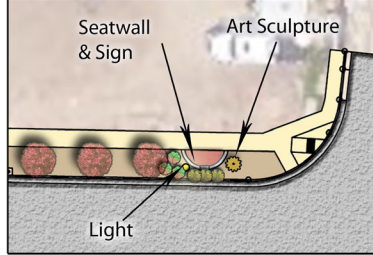
2 Central Ustick Townsite Street Crossing

4 North Corner Frontier & Ustick

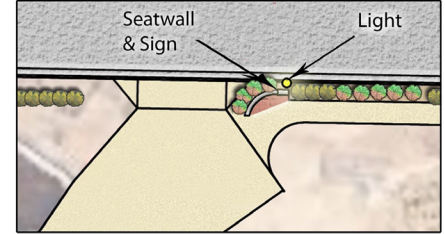

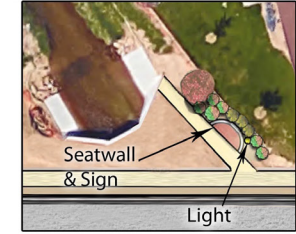

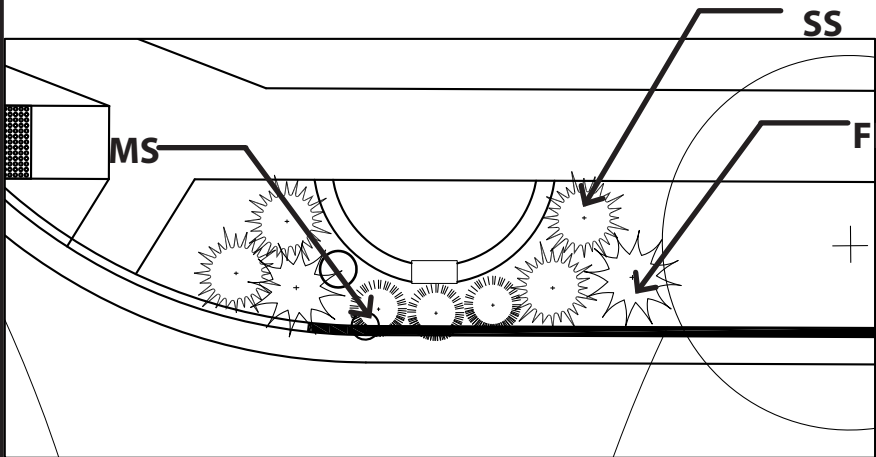
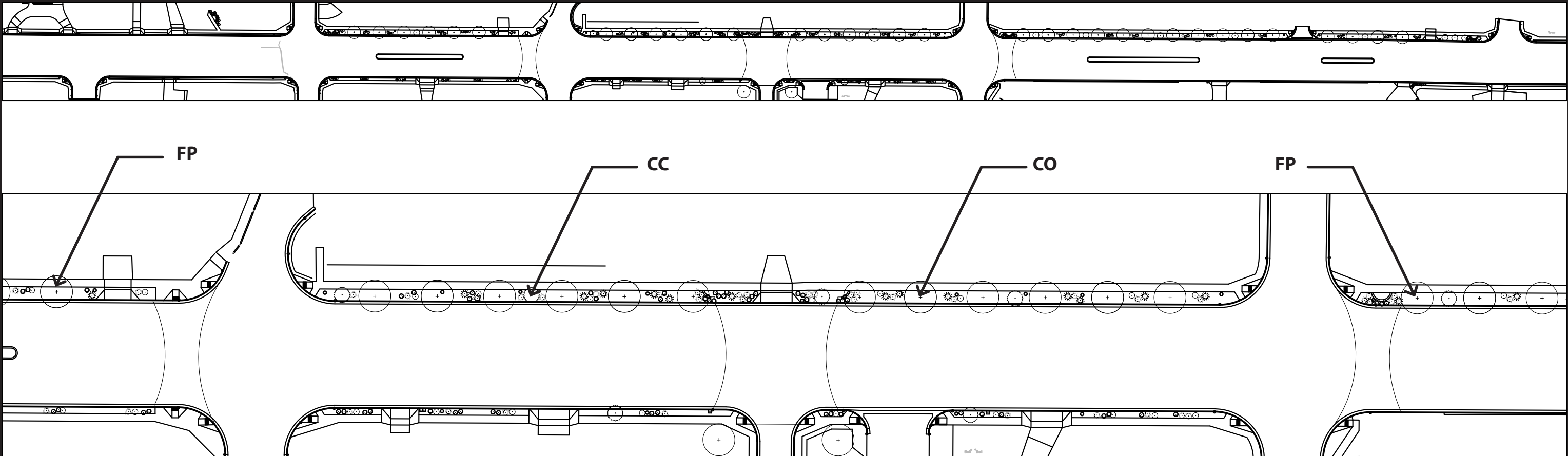
5 Southeast End Near Canal

Planting Plan



Corner Plantings: Forsythia shrubs will be planted at each corner along with Salvia, Rudbeckia, and Maiden Hair Grass. Daylily and tulip bulbs to be planted at crossings.

Street edge: Clusters of perennials to be planted between trees on north side of Ustick and along south side of Ustick: Salvia, Rudbeckia, Maiden Hair Grass, and Agastache.

Tree plantings: North side of Ustick to have trees planted at 40' intervals. Green Ash to be planted between Wildwood and Frontier to be consistent with upcoming development. The north side of the block between Bryson and Shamrock will also be planted with Green Ash. The central portion of the site will be planted with Common Hackberry to differentiate it as the core of the site. Eastern Redbud will be planted as an accent tree along the north and south portions of Ustick.

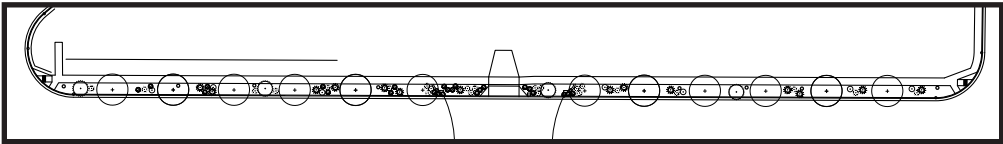

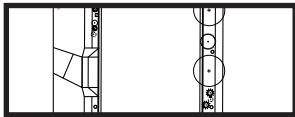
